Your Village Green and Trout Ponds Park are some of the good stuff about living in Northern Tioga County. Our many local employers along with our proximity to Binghamton, Route 17 Corridor and Ithaca jobs create a stable place for families. This Summer means staycation for many of us due to communicable health concerns that may be with us for a bit longer. The Trout Ponds playground equipment was significantly damaged last August with one of our many storms. Playground replacement and repair is complete; so, "come on down" and enjoy. We all are aware of PHASE FOUR physical distancing and our Park Pavilions and Restrooms can accommodate and are open. Actually, Bridal Showers and other family gatherings are happening as of this writing. Question: What resides within our Village of Newark Valley borders? Northern Tioga Chamber of Commerce, Tappan Spaulding Memorial Library, Newark Valley Historical Society Offices and Educational Depot, Tioga County Rural Ministry Satellite Office, Agriculture District with Working Farms, Food Pantry, Fantastic Contractors and Lawn Care Services, Long time Mechanics and Body Shops, Town of Newark Valley Public Works and Offices and lastly our Village of Newark Valley Public Works and Offices. At times, maybe during stressful times these life positives are forgotten and somewhat neglected. A great mantra to shop and buy locally. You will only miss them; when they are gone.

In late Summer and possibly early Fall; Your Deputy Mayor Cliff Alexander will Chair a Village Sub-Committee to review and analyze your Water Department. The current water use rates, capital reserve amounts and interest/debt dollars were established just after installation of Reservoir and Distribution System. Public Sector: Scott Evans, Matt Tomazin with one more to be determined; Village Board: Clifford Alexander, Jim Tornatore (ex-officio); Village Employees: Pamela Benthin and William Foster. This will impact users of our Water System with possible financial adjustments. Sub-Committee fact finding meetings will be open to our Public. Certain property owners have approached our Village Mayor and Trustees; stating their fees require review and possible adjustment. As we draw closer to establishing meeting dates; we will post on our web www.villageofnewarkvalley.com and Facebook: Village of Newark Valley. Your attendance and participation is important; because, in this Village "you are, part of the answer".

Municipal Building Window Renovation: Funding reminder: \$100K Grant Award from NYS Historic Preservation Park & Recreation/\$100K from Reserves/\$50K Grant Award from NYS Assembly. Status: Awaiting Signed Contract from NYS.

Long term Public Works employee Steve Pado retired in June. We do wish Steve and family many pleasant years of enjoyment. Village resident Matt Seamans has joined our Team and has begun his Water Training for eventual licensing. Good Fortune to Matt!

Your Trustees and Mayor; ever cognizant of budget are awaiting updates from our Congressman Tom Reed's Office. We are awaiting federal and state funding decision, that will include our 'local aid'. Twice monthly I participate in update Meetings with our Congressman and those are his messages at this time.

I asked our NV Fire Department to work with our Code Enforcement Officer concerning numerous vacant structures that may not be quickly up to NYS Code/Fire Standards. Your Fire Department and CEO are contacting the structure owners to begin the process.

Our Historical Society Depot has experienced some exterior vandalism from Spring going into Summer. Cameras are now everywhere so please caution those who wish to do harm. Broken windows, dinged doors and damaged electrical outlets are expensive repairs. Who knows why some people wish to do harm?

These Mayor comments do not include the most recent five months way of life. The Tornatore Family lost a loved one to COVID and so have many others. Even in hopefully temporary sadness such as Pandemic or traffic casualties; there is some hope for a good life.

The outpouring from our Community to the Class of 2020 exemplifies SPIRIT. Those parents, friends, educators, and students traveled far above expectations. We are so impressed!

The Village office still has some masks available. If you or your family are in need please feel free to stop by. We also have a few gallons of hand sanitizer available for local business. As a reminder, the Village office is open Monday thru Thursday 9:00 am – 5:00 pm and Friday 9:00 am – Noon.

The Trout **Ponds** playground equipment has been repaired/replaced after last year's microburst that caused much SO damage. We have heard that several little ones are really the enjoying new slide. With all this nice



weather take a little trip over to the park, but please remember to social distance and give everyone space so we all remain safe and healthy.

The Village Election that was originally scheduled for March then April is now rescheduled for



September 15th from Noon – 9:00 pm in the Noble Room of the Municipal Building. This year we have

two trustee positions, each for a four-year term. Cliff Alexander and John Tomazin will both be running for re-election. You must be a registered voter and Village resident to vote in this election.

Our AUD (Annual Update Document) is complete. For those of you who are not familiar with this, the AUD is the Village's equivalent of a tax return. Our CPA firm, *Insero & Co.* have just finished their annual audit.

Since many of us have been home these past few months and doing a lot of sorting and cleaning out, we'd like to remind residents that we do have 3yrd dumpsters available for rent at the flat rate cost of \$100.00. Stop by the office or give us a call and we can get you scheduled to have a dumpster dropped off.

Our next water meter reading will be August 14th for the September 1st water/solid waste billing.



The billing will go out September 1st and due by September 30th without penalty. After September 30th penalties will be assessed. Remember you can have your Water/Solid Waste bills deducted directly from your checking or savings account every quarter free of charge. One less bill for you to remember to pay. PUBLIC WORKS REPORT:

The DPW has been busy catching up since the re-opening of the county.

We have turned on the water and opened the bathrooms at the Trout Pond Park for the season. We are disinfecting the park facilities twice a day during the week and ask everyone for help in keeping the park as clean and safe as possible.

The storm damaged areas of the playground have been repaired or replaced and are ready for the youngsters of the Village to enjoy in these summer months.

The repaying of a portion of Whig Street has been completed, including freshly



painted lines, R&R crossing, and school crossings. The water runoff drains on Maple Ave. have been raised to a better and safer grade. Stop signs at Water Street and Maple Ave. have been replaced along with others, safety of our streets is one of our top priorities. And as

always, the upkeep of the Village Green and Trout Ponds Park will be continuing throughout the summer so that our residents have ample outdoor spaces to enjoy.

The water department has been busy with a main line repair on Maple Ave., service line repairs on Rock Street and John Street along with reseed each of the areas after repair are complete. New DPW employee, Matt Seamans certainly is getting his fill of hands on training.

We have had to replace the well pump at Well 3 due to a malfunction in the pump, this also forced us to adjust the VFD (variable frequency drives) equipment. This was all completed with no worry of contamination or lack of water supply; we have a water system with many backups and failsafes to protect the village residents and to maintain a safe water supply.

The only thing to report from the sanitation department is that new residents and others are purchasing oversized garbage cans. The Village code states, the maximum size is 32 gallons, and this is first and foremost for the safety of our sanitation crew. So please, before you purchase a new garbage can verify the size to avoid any future issues.

CODE ENFORCEMENT:

With the re-opening of the state I have been able to resume fire safety inspections throughout the Village. I will be continuing with the multi-family property safety inspection which includes properties with 2 or more units, and I will be scheduling inspections with the business/commercial properties that I was unable to inspect pre-COVID.

The NVFD and the Village have requested to inspect vacant properties to ensure the safety of the First Responders that protect our community. All owners of properties in question have been notified with a letter explaining the NYS Fire Code, section 311.5-311.5.5 which explains the requirements and procedure for placards being placed on these



properties, if applicable, to assist first responders. Owners have been asked to schedule an inspection with myself and a NV Fire Department representative to determine if the property does indeed require placement of a placard.

Building permits have been plentiful this spring season. I'd like to thank the homeowners and contractors, I have had great co-operation and communication with

all the building permits and the required inspection of these projects, thank you, its greatly appreciated.

The Tappan-Spaulding Memorial Library is delighted to be providing services for the community once again!

Although we are not open to the public at this time, we are providing curbside pickup on Tuesdays from Apm-8pm and Saturdays from 9am-1pm. In order to place holds on items to pick-up, you can access the online library catalog on our website, call the library at 607-642-9960 during open hours, or email director atsmlibrary.org. There are also copies of this tutorial available at Hollenbeck's Shurfine Grocery Store and in the lobby of the Municipal Building, as well as posted on the front doors of the library. You may begin placing holds on items from other libraries within the Finger Lakes Library System. Deliveries from other libraries will begin July 21st. When holds are ready for pickup, you should receive an automated call or email. Upon arrival, call the library and your items will be brought out to you.

Once books are returned, they will be quarantined for 72 hours before being checked back into the system. Unfortunately, because of the quarantine period, our automated phone calls and emails might be pestering you to return items that are overdue. Please ignore these for the time being, you will NOT be charged late fees for items that have been returned on the correct date but have been quarantined.



TIOGA COUNTY RURAL MINISTRY:


