I would eliminate the village and simply have it be part of the town, reducing administrative costs and therein reducing tax costs for residents. The water and garbage services could go up slightly in cost to ensure that the added position only impacts the former village residents, and does not raise taxes for those who were previously outside the village limits, while reducing tax costs overall for those within the current village limits by improving administrative efficiency. We need to do something to address the outrageous tax costs of living within the village limits, or I fear that within a matter of year the number of vacant properties and properties on the market will continue to rise. Newark Valley is a great, safe, community oriented place to live, but people are deterred from living within village limits, because the perks do not outweigh the cost. We might as well live outside the village limits, safe tax costs, and still reap the benefits of living near this wonderful area.

Additional comments,

The bottom line is most people want their independence which allows them to sleep in, bath when they want, eat when they want and with assistance it would be more cost efficient to remain in our homes. About mobile home parks - I am not opposed, I have family living in parks; however the codes that are on the books need to be reinforced. A mobile park does not need to be an eyesore, and it can be a great option for someone who can not afford to purchase a home.

All in all, I think Newark Valley is a fantastic little country town with easy access to larger towns as needed. It has a decent amount of trails, and provides the basics with the current shops that it has. I would like to see more room for home-based businesses but that's more customer driven, I think, than town driven where customers would RATHER go to an 'official' shop than a house. Perhaps a few more smaller commercial buildings would help!

It does not seem fair to me that retired senior citizens who live alone should be paying the same amount for garbage as the people who have 5 kids! I use 1/4 can a week, and my neighbors have 2 full ones a week. Why can't we have a choice? Also, why can't we be allowed to have another cable provider come into NV to offer much better deals than Spectrum does? Haefele from Spencer only charges about half what Spectrum does for the same services, but they are not allowed into NV. Thank you for asking our opinions.

Explanation of answer for #7 - I drive to Ithaca and then have to walk a mile into my office. Explanation of other for #14 - Proximity to work for both me and my husband, splits distance between Ithaca and Binghamton.

Question #5- I am a full time employee and full time college student. #6 I work in Binghamton and attend school online.

Whats needed is a no nonsense approach to code enforcement and those that impose the laws, fines & such! A no nonsense approach to those that own the property's that stand idle and nothing being done with them (some for years).

Thank you to our vilalge guys who clean up our streets in the spring!
