# Mayor's Message

Hello everyone,  
Window Restoration for your Municipal Building will begin at some point in March. During this project; many frames will be covered with wood protecting the building interior and our "not for profit" occupants. Not all of the windows will be restored at this time as finance is always our consideration. Exterior storms will be added to all of the restoration windows. If Funding Agency allows; we may or may not purchase all exterior storms as a hedge on inflation. We will report on this as time goes by.

Your Trustees developed and recommended a wise decision over one year ago. That decision to hire Village resident Matt Seamans to our DPW team. Matt; now is your Working Supervisor of Public Works. In this brief period of time Matt has gained CDL and Water Licensing credentials to best serve our Community. Recently; your Trustees recommended hiring Mike Walburn as the third member of the DPW team. This frigid weather of late and our clear roads document the talent of Scot Coombs, Mike Walburn and Matt Seamans. Trustee Scott Kasmarcik is liaison to Matt and Public Works; is listening and conveying recommendations to all of us.

Soon, we will create an objective subcommittee to review our Water and Solid Waste fee structures. Many of you may remember our fee adjustments during the Water Distribution and Reservoir project just over ten years ago. Time to review once again. Your Office Staff is building financials based upon previous years data. Will report to you as this progresses.

We taxpayers will not see an increase this year due to full Board approval. In early January; Trustee

John Tomazin, Clerk/Treasurer Pam Benthin and Matt Seamans presented zero based tax rate.

A reminder to us all that clearing of sidewalks after inclement weather lowers the risk of walker injury.

If you needed another reason to look forward to spring, we have good news. Artist Expressions at the Trout Ponds is back!! After a break for a few years, the Village has been awarded a grant from the Arts Council of the Southern Finger Lakes. **Mark your calendars** - The Village will welcome *The Watts* on May 21<sup>st</sup> and *Ain't MisBehavin* on June 18<sup>th</sup> both concerts will be from 5:00 pm to 8:00 pm. We have just completed the budget process and I am pleased to let you know that the Board was able to pass next fiscal year's budget with a zero percent increase. This means that the tax bills that will be mailed out March 1<sup>st</sup> will have a zero percent increase.

Speaking of taxes, tax payments will be due by March 31<sup>st</sup> with no penalty, payments are accepted through October 31<sup>st</sup> with penalties applied. Payments can be made in-person at the Village office (located at the rear entrance of 9 Park St.) placed in the drop box located at the Village office entrance, mailed, or paid on-line. Please note, if you plan to pay on-line our credit card processor AllPaid, does charge a processing fee. This is not a Village fee. The link to make an online payment can be found on our webpage under the online payments tab. We also offer a direct debit option from your bank account each billing month. This service is free of charge, if you are interested please contact the office for an application.

Are you doing a bit of cleaning out while the cold weather is here? If so, did you know that the Village offers 3-yard dumpsters for rent for a fee of \$100. Simply contact the Village office at 642-8686 to have one delivered. You can get ahead on your spring cleaning this year.

The Village has hired a new Code Enforcement Officer. Please welcome Marty Jerzak to the Village. Village code enforcement can be reached at [vonvcode@stny.rr.com](mailto:vonvcode@stny.rr.com).

Our 9 Brook St. acquisition and demolition project is complete. The Village will receive 100% reimbursement for this project from FEMA. We have submitted reimbursement request and are awaiting completion of this process.

Many changes amidst the DPW this year so far and its only February!

To begin, I'd like to wish Bill Foster a happiest of retirements, a thank you for your many years of devoted service to the Village and a note of appreciation for all the knowledge you have shared with me.

For those that don't know me, I'm Matt Seamans your new Public Works Supervisor. I have been working for the Village since spring of 2020, a Village resident for 6 years and a life long Northern Tioga County

resident. It is my honor and privilege to serve this wonderful little village.

Filling the third DPW crew member position, we'd like to welcome Micheal Walburn to the village team! Mike, a Newark Valley resident is young, energetic, and eager to learn, he will be a great asset to the DPW team and this village. Welcome aboard Mike!

The lighting of the Village Green certainly was a spectacular sight this year, with more trees than ever! Your DPW crew will be tackling the electrical setup this summer in hopes to eliminate the minor hiccups that occurred. Also, a thank you to everyone for getting their trees undecorated in a timely manner so that we could recycle the trees when scheduled.

A few reminders to help make the village a safer place for you and my DPW crew. Sidewalks, if we have some snowfall or sleet with ice build-up, sidewalks are to be cleared within 24hours. Garbage cans, we start collection early when traffic is minimal, please have your cans to the curb no later than 6:00am. Can size maximum is 32 gal and please, for the physical safety of the crew, keep cans under the maximum of 50#. With the village garbage service, you are allowed 2 cans per week, if you need to put out an extra can, or have a larger item that needs to be disposed of, stop at the Village office and they will be able to assist you with the appropriate tag for your item. For those of you that have a fire hydrant in front of your home, while it is not mandatory, it is recommended that you clear around the hydrant. In the event of an emergency, we would want the fire department to have easy, quick access to all safety measures. The DPW does make our way around the village clearing the hydrants once your streets have been cleared and are safe for travel but with 70+

hydrants in the Village, it's a slow clearing process. At the very least, we ask that you do not shovel or plow additional snow from your walkways around the hydrants. As always, myself and the DPW crew will continue working hard to keep our Village streets, sidewalks, and parks clean and safe.

## Code Enforcement

Well, winter sure is here and it feels like it's going to hold on for a while this year. With that said, two reminders follow, winter parking and maintaining safe sidewalks.

The Winter Parking code reads as follows:  
***§ 157-43 Schedule XV: Parking Prohibited Certain Hours.***

- ***No parking on any highway or private road, either side, within the corporate limits of the Village of Newark Valley from 12:00 midnight to 6:00 a.m. from November 1 to April 1***
- ***No parking in parking lots contiguous to the municipal building on 9 Park Street in the Village of Newark Valley (except for designated areas for emergency personnel) from 12:00 midnight to 6:00 a.m. from November 1st to April 1st.***

Maintaining snow/ice on Village sidewalks code reads as follows:

***§ 140-32 Time limit for removal of snow and ice.***

- *A. The Village Board deems it to be a matter of public safety and that from October 1 of each year until April 15 of the following year the following time limits for removal of snow and ice shall be in effect, and the property owner shall be responsible for the removal of ice and snow within the time limits prescribed below without any further notice by the Village: Snow and ice shall be removed within 24 hours after the end of a snowfall on noncommercial establishments. Sidewalks in front of commercial establishments and commercial parking lots shall be kept free of snow and ice at all times between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m.*
- *B. The failure to remove ice and snow in the time period set forth above shall be deemed to be a public emergency, thus allowing the Village to have such ice and snow removed, pursuant to § 140-29I(3)(a) without any further notice to the property owner.*

Past practice has been to send complaint notices to property owners regarding uncleared sidewalks. This practice in turn kept sidewalks in unsafe conditions for an extended period of time. Going forward, if sidewalks are uncleared 24hrs after snow/ice fall the Public Works Department will commence clearing without notice and the property will be billed accordingly.

Please follow both codes to make your Village streets easier for the DPW to plow and safer for you and your fellow Villagers to travel.


