- J. Tornatore Ladder Factory discussion of opening bids next wk. In theory project should be completed by end of March. It will take at least 6 months to be reimbursed from NYS. Will use B.A.N to pay for project until reimbursement comes in. Excitement and relief that this project is finally coming to fruition from all.
- J. Tornatore LED Project discussion. J. Frieman voiced concerned about making sure there are replacement parts for these fixtures ordered at the time of the install. Concern due to current parts becoming obsolete quickly when new advancements in technology happen every year or so. J. Tornatore will bring up at board meeting to either buy new replacement parts to have on hand or put into the contract that upgrades to equipment be included.
- J Tornatore current projects review: Ladder Factory, LED Light and Municipal Building Windows. Announced that the Village was turned down for the grant to have windows upgraded. Discussion about setting funds aside in the budget to pay for windows in a few years. Discussion to have the work sub-contracted out in small increments at a time can be cheaper than trying to do whole project at once. Discussion about one day selling the Municipal Building and moving the office to property on Whig Street.
- J. Tornatore announced that he will be running for Mayor one last time then he is officially retiring.

Discussion of upcoming Soil/Water Flood Mitigation project. Slosson Creek- resident side wall deteriorating, Trout Pond's natural flow issues, and Cook St & Smullen Ave water run off issues. Cook St. running into Hollenbeck's. When Family \$ went in the lot was raised causing water flow issues that were unforeseen and not fully thought through. Residential expansion of Town uphill affects downhill Village. The big picture always needs to be thoroughly thought through and when coming up with a solution to a problem there needs to be a check process to see the domino effect that a fix might have on the big picture.
