## WORK IN PROGRESS:

- 1. Storm Update- On July 13<sup>th</sup> flash flooding caused significant damage to roadways and houses throughout the village with Rock Street, Brook Street and Main Street being the hardest hit. Many volunteers and emergency services from surrounding municipalities responded and assisted our community throughout the night. In the following days we asked that residents separate biodegradable yard debris from damaged household debris to be picked up on July 23<sup>rd</sup> at no cost to them. We are working with county emergency services and the offices of Representative Langworthy and Governor Hochel to establish this storm as a FEMA declared disaster. This is a lengthy process with no guarantee. A local engineering consultant toured the storm damage and is working on an estimate report. The timeline for repairs is uncertain at this point. We urge residents who suspect structural damage to their homes to contact Code Enforcement. NYS Homeland Security and Emergency Services has a "Damage Self-Report Tool" residents impacted by flooding may complete. This provides information for federal aid requests; however, it is not an application. The form can be found at https://arcg.is/0ybK4H0
- **2. Garbage Truck-** DPW is still researching a used garbage truck for purchase, however, due to the severity of the recent storms, focus is on cleanup and restoration of the village.

  continue to work alongside NVFD in maintaining fire hydrants in compliance with NFPA.

- Mayor- Focusing on FEMA prospects with concentration on communicating with Representative Langworthy's office.

- **Library-** Summer Reading Program and several special events coincide with Summer Rec and are having extremely positive reviews.
- Municipalities- Opened Noble Room for cooling/charging station during power outages from storms.
